<p><u>What to expect as a NOAA Corps Inter-Service Transfer (IST) Aviator:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pilots selected for heavy aircraft can expect to also fly a light aircraft. • Navigators can expect to serve as Project Manager for various missions. • 4 - 6 months TDY supporting NOAA Missions – If assigned to a Hurricane Hunter platform, you will be on the Hurricane Watch Bill from 1 June through 30 November plus various projects throughout the year. • Initial Operational Aviation Assignment at Aircraft Operations Center (AOC) in Lakeland, FL (KLAL) – 5 years. Follow-on assignments are 3 years. • AOC Staff Job/Ground Duties - Serve as a Section, Deputy Branch or Branch Chief in one of AOC's Branches • Pay and benefits (including retirement) do not change from your current service, no Department Head bonus. • Not eligible for promotion for 12 months from start date. • May incur Active Duty Service Obligation (ADSO) dependent on NOAA-funded training. • Aviation bonus may be available contingent on signing a 5-year service commitment.
